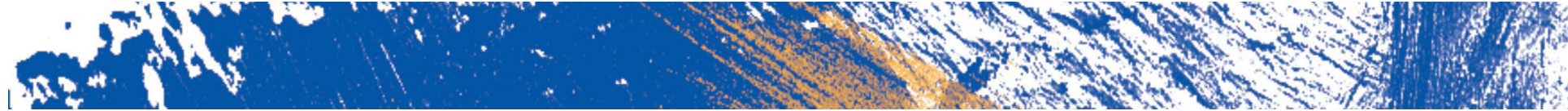
"I have been a long time donor for United Way of Lane County, but had not really engaged as a volunteer until I had the opportunity to participate with the 100% Health Community Coalition.
